DESIGNING THE BRIDGE

- ◆ 2007 permanent funding from U.S. Congress to provide training to combat Medicaid FWA.
- ◆ Collaboration between CMS, States, and OLE
 - ◆ Designed the curriculum
 - ◆ Provided the SMEs
- ◆ Focus groups and five courses first year
- ◆ Twenty-one courses and two on-site working groups scheduled for FY14

BUILDING THE BRIDGE

- ◆ Certified Program Integrity Professional (CPIP)
 - ◆ Working Group at MII
 - ◆ Reviewed the curricula for the three core courses
 - ◆ Designed tests for all three courses
 - ◆ Distance Learning presentation December 2012
 - ◆ Posted on RISS
 - ◆ Recruited Proctors from each state
 - ◆ Trained Proctors
 - ◆ Built in procedures for consistency and fairness
 - ◆ Administered the tests, notified students of results

RETURN ON INVESTMENT

- ❖ The state of New Mexico recovered over \$1 million from Durable Medical Equipment (DME) wheelchair and hospital bed audit activities based on knowledge gained by attending the *Interactions between Medicaid Fraud Control Units and Program Integrity Units Symposium*.
- ❖ The state of Connecticut has recognized \$25 million in cost avoidance due to information obtained at the MII from various trainings.

RETURN ON INVESTMENT

- ❖ The state of Kansas was able to identify potential improper payments for personal care services amounting to more than \$131,000 and for inpatient services amounting to more than \$10,000 based on information learned at the *Provider Auditing Fundamentals program*.

RETURN ON INVESTMENT

- ❖ Arizona faculty member asked to present in Michigan
- ❖ Tennessee faculty member asked to present in Virginia

Praise for the MII

- ◆ GAO Report -13-50: the 11 state PI officials we interviewed affirmed the value of the MII for substantive training.
- ◆ NAMD encouraged additional investment in the MII
- ◆ Congressional interest –the Senate Finance Committee urged expansion of the MII.
- ◆ MII Annual Report- CMS: Contributed to fighting FWA
